## LHI Board News

## Tanzania

Here are excerpts from an e-mail received from Pastor Jerome on September 18. Jerome had been in the hospital with malaria and typhoid fever. He had just returned from a trip to the member churches throughout northern Tanzania around Lake Victoria. He was visiting them to determine if they are still conducting services and still teaching the truths of Scripture.



Good afternoon my dear Brother Herschel. Lois and all Brethren in Anderson Chapel and elsewhere in America who joined you in prayer for me. I hope you are doing fine as well as all churches. I am now feeling fine. I take this opportunity to thank all of you for your prayers you offered for me during a week of my health trial. It began the day I visited our lawyer, and soon after leaving his office, I began feeling cold and some unwellness in my body. I took it as a normal thing and treated it lightly by just going to the pharmacy and taking some anti-pain tablets. I used to do this very often, but this time things seemed to become worse. When midnight came, I felt things working different by feeling fever and tiredness and other ways of bad feeling. Also sweating and pain. It was at that time I sent you a text message to share with you about this.

When morning arrived I was in very hard time and then I went to the dispensary to get treatment. The doctor examined me and then admitted me there with two drips then he gave me some tablets to continue with. I felt relief for a while but things began in fresh invasion. In dispensary, the doctor told me there was typhoid and severe malaria but he advised me to remember to go to the hospital when I get relief because they don't have some microscopes to examine some other areas.

As I told you things changed suddenly. After going there, I was admitted again and dripped two drips again and the doctors discovered some typhoid and severe malaria and some sort of poison in my blood. The treatment to cool it began and after some days I felt recovery. When I got off from dispensary, I felt like deafness because of drips and losing of appetite. It happened the same evening after getting off from the hospital, but through tablets I am using, I am now feeling good and I am eating as usual.

It makes me glad to know how much you have shared of my condition to many people. Please share my thanks to Lois and everyone. I was advised to return back to the hospital for further check-up after one week.
